

## AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) APPLICATION

Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) strikes more than 350,000 Americans each year, which is nearly one death everyone two minutes. With early treatment of CPR and an AED, those who suffer a SCA, nearly double their chance of survival. For each minute without such treatment, the chance of survival decreases by 7 to 10 percent.

The lowa Heart Center Foundation program awards AEDs tonon-profit organizations in an effort to increase survival rates in lowa related to SCA. Priority for placement will be awarded based upon the following criteria: (1) lowa organization (2) demonstrated financial need (3) population and number served, and (4) proposed impact of the scope of placement.

## STATE REGULATIONS FOR AED IMPLEMENTATION

In the event your organization is awarded an AED, please acknowledge an agreement to follow state regulations outlined below:

lowa Good Samaritan Act. lowa Code 613.17. This act provides that a person who is in good faith renders emergency care and assistance, without compensations, shall not be responsible for civil damages for any acts of omissions during the provision of emergency care. The statute specifically indicates that "for purposes of this section, a person rendering emergency care or assistance includes a person involved in a workplace rescue arising out of an emergency or accident." This Good Samaritan Act provides protection to a rescuer, even an untrained rescuer, who used an AED on a cardiac arrest victim.

- 1. Appoint responsibility for the management of the AED to a person.
- 2. Assume responsibility for the purchase and replacement of batteries, pads and other supplies (as needed).
- 3. Ensure inspections and maintenance in accordance with written user and service recommendations provided by the manufacturer.
- 4. Agree to the responsibility to train sufficient staff (at least one trained staff person) on site during normal business hours. The lowa Heart Center Foundation agrees to provide initial AED training as part the AED donation.
